

**Lecturer Position**  
**David R. Cheriton School of Computer Science**  
**University of Waterloo**

The David R. Cheriton School of Computer Science at the University of Waterloo invites applications for a three-year definite-term appointment at the rank of Lecturer. A master's degree in computer science or a related discipline is required and a doctorate is preferred. Candidates are also expected to have some teaching experience. Candidates with teaching experience in HCI or Computer Systems are particularly encouraged to apply, but candidates in all areas will be considered. The preferred start date for this appointment is May 1 or September 1, 2014.

The position will normally have a teaching load of five one-term courses per year and administrative and scholarly duties as determined by the Director of the School, principally advising undergraduate students. Reappointment at the end of the term is possible. An eventual appointment as a continuing lecturer is possible after three years in a definite term appointment.

With approximately 80 faculty members, the University of Waterloo's David R. Cheriton School of Computer Science is the largest in Canada. It enjoys an excellent reputation in pure and applied research, and houses a diverse research program of international stature. Because of its recognized capabilities, the School attracts exceptionally well-qualified students at both undergraduate and graduate levels. In addition, the University has an enlightened intellectual property policy which vests rights in the inventor: this policy has encouraged the creation of many spin-off companies.
